

Day 1 - Monday June 20th - Wiesbaden, Rheingau all day

organized by ZC Mainz and ZC Wiesbaden

We will organize a transfer from Frankfurt (bus or cars depending on the number of participants) and start with a leisurely walk through Wiesbaden Kurpark and Kurhaus. We will then take a ride with the historic Nerobergbahn, Europe's second-oldest water-powered funicular railway, to the top of Neroberg, the largest hill in Wiesbaden. We will enjoy a fantastic view across the Rhine and all the way to Odenwald and visit the Russian chapel at Neroberg. We will continue with the bus driving along the Rhine to Kloster Eberbach, a fantastic medieval monastery and the location used for the movie 'The Name of the Rose'. We can do a tour through the monastery and have coffee or lunch in the 'Klosterschänke'. We will continue driving along the Rhine and cross to Bingen with a ferry where we will end the day with a wine tasting and 'Vesper' (rustic cold cuts and bread) in the middle of the vineyard if weather permits. Transfer back to the hotel in Frankfurt will be around 6 pm.

Cost about 110 EUR + Lunch per person depending on transport and number of participants.

Day 2 - Tuesday June 21st - Bad Homburg

organized by ZC Bad Homburg

Bad Homburg is located at the gates of Frankfurt. It has a picturesque historic city center with small alleys, the castle of the local count with a beautiful park and Germany's largest spa park. You can find the first European tennis court outside England and the oldest golf park of Germany here as well as the most famous Casino in Europe. Bad Homburg is known for its healing mineral waters. Germany's last king Kaiser Wilhelm II. had his summer home in Bad Homburg and contributed a large neo-byzantine church as well as a spa. Close to Bad Homburg you can find the Roman castello Saalburg, which was reconstructed between 1897 and 1907 and is part of the UNESCO cultural heritage of the Limes in Germany, the borders of the Roman Empire.

We will end the day with a dinner in a traditional German restaurant in Bad Homburg.

Day 3 - Wednesday June 22nd - Frankfurt am Main

Guided tour Frankfurt historic center (20 EUR per person)

In the morning we will have a guided tour through the new historic center of Frankfurt, which was destroyed in 1944 and rebuilt between 2012 and 2018. Some of the houses were reconstructed from old building plans, some others were newly constructed with a matching modern design.

Lunch

Städelmuseum, guided tour (25 EUR per person)

In the afternoon we will visit museum and get a guided tour through the permanent exhibits. The ‚Städelsche Kunstinstitut‘ is a cultural foundation, which was established in 1815 as a civic foundation of Frankfurt citizens. The museum with its collection is now one of the most renowned art museums in Germany.
